NC DKG Convention This Month

The NC DKG Convention will be held in Asheville April 29-May 1, 2022, at the Crowne Plaza Resort. This will be the first in-person convention in a couple of years, and state leaders are looking forward to seeing you there.

Registration is open, and the deadline to register to be guaranteed meals and materials is April 10. There will be on-site registration for a slightly higher fee. Registration is through a Google form and may be paid by check or credit card. Detailed information is on the registration form.

One Rules Proposal for State Convention

The Rules Committee will be submitting one proposal to the convention floor for a vote. The Finance Committee submitted the proposal to add a rule to Section E. General Rules for Finance that reads, "In addition to the Treasurer's name, the names of the President and Executive Secretary shall be added to the Available fund and Headquarters banking accounts."

Delta Chi members with thoughts on this should contact Co-presidents Tamarah Cornette or Elizabeth Thornton so they will know your opinion before they vote during the Executive Board meeting. If approved by the Executive Board during its meeting on Friday, the proposal will be presented to the general assembly during the Second General Meeting on Saturday morning.
