Scholarships Available

One of the benefits of DKG membership is the numerous scholarships available to members.

At the May meeting, 2nd Vice President Lori Holguin shared the ease of applying for and receiving scholarships. Our chapter offers a scholarship to members, which Lori received to attend a TESOL workshop. She also received an NCDKG Educational Foundation Scholarship to fund that workshop attendance. Since applications to NCDKGEF are due in September of each year, Lori suggested members start planning ahead and review all the options available on their website at <u>https://www.ncdkgef.org/</u> under the grants and scholarship tabs.

NC DKG offers scholarships for members working on advanced degrees. Applicants must be a member for minimum of two years to apply for these. A postbaccalaureate and a doctoral scholarship are available. Applications are due February 1 of each year. (No applicants met the criteria for the postbaccalaureate degree this year so if you are working on a Masters or advanced degree, apply!) Info on the scholarships are posted on the <u>NC DKG Scholarship</u> <u>Committee webpage</u>.

International offers a multitude of scholarships, including several \$10,000 scholarships for doctoral work. Dr. Donna Cotton and Dr. Susan Blackburn both took advantage of these funds. Check the <u>DKGIEF website</u> for dates and applications.


Deadlines Nearing for Both International Conferences
