NC DKG Convention Coming Soon

The NC DKG Convention will be held in Asheville April 29-May 1, 2022, at the Crowne Plaza Resort. This will be the first in-person convention in a couple of years, and state leaders are looking forward to seeing you there.

<u>Registration</u> is open, and the deadline to register to be guaranteed meals and materials is April 10. There will be on-site registration for a slightly higher fee. Registration is through a Google form and may be paid by check or credit card. Detailed information is on the <u>registration form</u>.

As you may know, we are entering the final stages of vacating the Headquarters building at 416 W. 12th Street and moving to a new, leased space farther north in Austin. Per the recommendation of the Ad Hoc Committee on Disposition of Society Documents and HQ Furnishings and as approved by the International Administrative Board, an in-person estate sale will be held in the building at 416 W. 12th Street on February 19 (9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. CT) and 20 (10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. CT).
