Delta Chi achieved its highest award yet at the Eta State NC Convention the end of April in Wilmington—the Excellence Award for Chapter Achievement, which is the middle category of three levels of achievement.

Chapters achieving the Excellence Award had accumulated 475 points or more. Points are based on activities, participation, attendance and other criteria defined on the Chapter Achievement Award form as determined by the Eta State NC Awards Committee.

Delta Chi also received awards of excellence for our newsletter and website. We received certificates for each, which will be on display during our 50th anniversary celebration on May 15.

In addition to the Rising Star Award (page 1), **Andrea Byers** shared about her grant from the Educational Foundation during the Foundation's annual meeting on Saturday morning. She also was part of the Foundation's grants session on Saturday afternoon.

Linda Little participated in the Convention Chorus that sang at the Saturday night Banquet Honoring Presidents and during the Celebration of Remembrance on Sunday morning.

President Dr. Susan Blackburn was honored to retire the American flag at the closing ceremony on Sunday.
