Calling All DKG Members: Time to "Light a Spark" for NC Education

The 2018 election is just around the corner and all public school students in North Carolina are counting on US to "Light a Spark" for education by casting our votes for pro-education candidates at all levels of government. For the past decade our schools and teachers have been slowly starved of needed funding. We need to put NC back in its previous position as an exemplary state for high quality education and a well prepared workforce. Our future depends on returning our schools to their former glory. Now is the time to start!

Early voting begins on October 17 and goes through Saturday, November 3rd. In case anyone is not registered to vote, they may register and vote on the same day during early voting. This is called "One-Stop Voting." Call your local Board of Elections to find out where the early voting sites are in your county. You may go to any early voting site you wish. No photo ID is required to register or to vote.

On the official voting day, Tuesday, November 6, voters must vote in their own precinct. Let's all prepare now to spark a North Carolina education comeback in 2018!

Sharon Guenther shared this in the summer: My mother had a very bad fall and has cracker her pelvis. It was also discovered that she has a severe case of pneumonia in her right lung. I took her to the doctor, then he sent us straight to the hospital emergency room in Gboro. She was there for a day and a half, then transferred to Moses Cone Hospital (also in Gboro). She has been in intensive care, on a breathing machine, had a drain placed in the lung to drain the fluid and infection out. It is working well and last night she came off of oxygen and was eating for the first time in days. While this has been going on, my father in law had a heart attack and is also at Moses Cone Hospital awaiting open heart surgery for triple by-pass surgery on Wednesday of this week. I have been running myself ragged between both of them.

I ask for prayers for both Margaret Pettit, my mother, and Clint Guenther, my father-in-law. Hopefully things will be better for both soon. Day by day!

Update: Clint (my father-in-law) was sent home this afternoon one week after quadruple by-pass surgery. He seems to be doing very well. He will have some in-home therapy and some help with bathing for a few days. And, they got him a lift chair that was also delivered today.

Margaret (my mother) was released and sent to a rehab facility just 6 minutes away from her home and my sister's home. She will probably be there for about 20 days and we will reassess how she is doing re-learning some independent living skills. I got her settled in with some of her own clothes, and blankets etc. about 8:30 this evening. I will go back tomorrow morning to learn the routine of the place and to help with an assessment of what she can do and what to expect with rehab. She has a long way to go before being able to live alone again which is her goal.

Continued prayers please.

Sharon sent this update this week: My mother is doing much, much better. After her 16 day stay in the hospital and 18 days in Rehab, she was able to go back home and stay by herself again. She is continuing to do exercises each day and some light housework.

My father in law is recovering slowing from his quadruple bypass surgery this summer. He is beginning out patient rehab 3 days a week, and is beginning to gain some energy back. It has taken much longer to bounce back to normal than he had anticipated.

Thanks so much for everyone's prayers. It was definitely a summer to remember, and would I would like to forget and not repeat.

The NC DKG Educational Foundation is awarding two \$2,500 Marilyn F. Grinwis Gray Scholarship Grants this fall. These new awards are being made for spring semester 2019 from an endowment through Theta Chapter.

Scholarships are available for degree work in Music Education or Elementary Education. Applicants may be enrolled in Baccalaureate, Master's, or Doctoral study in either of these areas of education. Applications are open to everyone.

The proposal form is available on the Educational Foundation website (www.ncdkgef.org). Proposals are due November 20, 2018, so apply now! Awards will be made by December 5, 2018, in time for spring semester.

Membership Changes Adopted at Convention

At the International Convention in Austin in July, several changes concerning membership occurred.

- 1. We now use the word "induct" rather than the word "initiate." (Constitution III.A.1&2)
- 2. A new member becomes a member of the International Society in addition to a state organization and/or a chapter. (Constitution III.A.1) 3
- 3. An individual becomes a member of the Society when she pays her dues rather than when she is inducted. (Constitution III.A.1.&2)
- 4. The requirement of being initiated within one year of paying dues is no longer valid. (Standing Rules 3.01)
- 5. Membership is open not only to active and retired educators but also to anyone who has ever taught. (Constitution III.B.1)
- 6. Add "Collegiate Members" to the types of membership. Collegiate members must be in last two years of undergraduate work or have graduate standing. When a collegiate member starts her career as a paid educator, she will pay active member dues and become an active member. If a collegiate member does not pursue a career in education or drops from an educational degree program, her membership expires. International dues will be \$20. A collegiate member may participate in all activities of the Society except holding an elected office. (Constitution III.B.4, Standing Rules 3.4 and 4.11)
- Chapters may select candidates for members by the method determined by the chapter. However, the method must be established by the chapter rules. (Constitution III.C.1)

Payment Due Date to Change

Another amendment adopted at the Convention pertained to payments of dues and fees:

"The membership year is July 1 - June 30. A member shall pay annual dues and fees no later than June 30 for the following fiscal year."

This change will take effect in 2019, so members will want to make note of it and plan to pay dues before the end of the school year this coming summer. Delta Chi will take payments if members would rather break up the dues amount.
